

#### What's that on your forehead?

Dear Friends in Christ,

When I arrived home from our Ash Wednesday service just over a week ago, the first words from my granddaughter were, "Grandpa, what's that on your forehead?" The smudged cross on my forehead was still visible. We talked a bit about the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent that leads to Holy Week and Easter.

"What's that on your forehead?" Perhaps you have received the same question. Ashes are placed on the foreheads of Christians throughout the world on Ash Wednesday as an <u>outward</u> sign signifying the importance of <u>inner</u> repentance. The Lord God spoke these words to Adam and Eve after they ate of the forbidden fruit: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" [Gen. 3:19]. We quote these words as a cross is made on the forehead with ashes.


These ashes, the marking of the cross and the spoken words remind each penitent worshipper of our sinfulness and our mortality. We acknowledge that we are human and that we will one day die, and therefore, that we need to repent and be honest ("come clean") with God. Yet, the cross itself also reminds us of the good news that through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, there is forgiveness of sins and redemption.

You and I are now in our journey through the 40-day season of Lent (Sundays are considered "mini-Easter celebrations" and are not counted in the forty days before Easter). We remember that our Lord was led into the wilderness for forty days during which He fasted and prayed, and was tempted by Satan. Lent helps us to reflect upon areas of our own lives that could use amendment and correction. To "repent" means to turn away from sin and turn back toward God. Jesus models for us the importance of prayer and fasting and devotion to God.

You are invited and encouraged to strengthen your own devotional practices: setting aside regular time for reading and reflection on the words of Scripture; time for prayer and meditation; and faithfulness in worship.

May God bless your Lenten journey and the Holy Spirit prepare you for the events of Holy Week and the celebration of our Lord's resurrection!



Liz O'Jimenez & Lillian O'Davis will host a traditional St. Patty's Day meal of Cuban Pork and black beans & rice.





# Apostles Preschool News

Apostles Lutheran Church Preschool is currently enrolling for the 2015-2016 school year. This includes the 4 yr. old VPK & 3 yr. old programs.

#### 4 year old VPK Program:

If your child will be 4 prior to September 1, 2015, he/she may qualify for our VPK program financed by the State of Florida. Classes are from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM. There is no tuition for this program. There is a registration fee to ensure your child's place, as well as a nominal \$50.00/month fee for this extra hour/day of instruction. Your child must attend 5 days a week for the entire school year to remain in this program.

#### 3 year old PK:

## Martin Luther: the fastest selling Playmobil figure ever!

In 1517, when Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany, he changed the history of the world. Now, just two years before the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, a tiny model of the Great Reformer has made history - in the world of toys!

Known for its sets of little plastic figures, Playmobil, the German toy manufacturer, has created a miniature Luther. Dressed in a cloak and hat, he holds a quill in his right hand and a copy of the Bible in the other. The Good Book is, of course, in German: one of Luther's many achievements was translating the scriptures into the vernacular, so that all German-speakers could read it.

In a mere 72 hours, all 34,000 of Luther figures had sold. "That's the fastest-selling toy of all time," according to a Playmobil spokesperson. Now their factory has dropped everything to make more of these highly-collectible mini-Luthers. Created as an educational toy for Germany's Evangelical Lutheran Church, almost all of the figures have been sold in Germany. The next batch won't be released until the end of April.

There have even been requests for Playmobil to design a miniature Wartburg Castle. Famous as the place where Luther translated the Bible into German, this castle is outside the city of Eisenach in LutherCountry.

For the past eight years, the German federal states of Saxony-Anhalt and Thuringia have been building up to 2017 and the world-wide celebrations of Martin Luther and his achievements.


